November's Gardener's Diary

What we can do this month in the vegetable garden is: clearing any rubbish off the soil to prepare for

manure or compost. The best way is to cover the ground with compost and leaves, leaving it until next year to dig in, allowing the worms to work it into the soil

Don't forget you can plant Garlic and Broad Beans this month, so they will have a great start in the spring.

Rake up all the leaves you can for the compost heap, if you have a rotary mower try running over them to break them up and you will find they will compost down quicker.

Check the onions to see if any are rotten. If they are, throw them away, the same with potatoes.

Don't forget to raise your mower up for the last cut of the year!

Recipe of the Month: Boozy Mincemeat

(Makes about 3.5 kg/7lbs- could easily be halved.)

Ingredients

500g currants

500g raisins

500g sultanas

500g Bramley apples peeled, cored and finely chopped

2 x 200g boxes shredded suet

100g blanched almonds - coarsely chopped

350g demerara sugar

100g dark muscovado sugar

1 rounded tsp ground cinnamon

2 rounded tsp mixed spice

1 lemon

250g mixed peel

125ml dark rum

125ml Disaronno liqueur or Amaretto



Method

Put the dried fruit in a very large bowl with the apple, suet, almonds, sugars and spices.

Grate the lemon into the bowl and then squeeze in the juice. Tip in the peel and alcohol.

Mix all the ingredients thoroughly and cover and leave for 24 hours, stirring occasionally. Pack the mincemeat into sterilised or dishwasher cleaned jars. Seal tightly and store in a cool place. Best used within six months.

Bad Internet Behaviours and How To Fix Them -Copycat 'Official' Websites

It's possible to process or renew many official documents without paying a fee, but when you search for the relevant website it's often the case that a 'copycat website' will appear that offers the same service but charges a fee to

do so. Such sites are not actually illegal, but they do have to make it clear that they're not affiliated to the official site.

Examples of this include: Driving licence renewals and theory tests, Passport applications, Ultra Low Emission Zone (ULEZ) and congestion payments, Visa applications, Tax return sites, European Health Insurance Cards (EHIC), Birth and marriage certificates, etc.

To avoid falling for such sites the first tip is to remember that such sites exist! So here are some tips.

 Check the web address - look for a secure 'https://' rather than an 'http://' at the beginning of the website's address. This is especially important if you are about to enter personal information as it indicates that there is encryption in place to protect your personal details;

- websites just with http://don't encrypt your details.
- Did the search identify a paid-for search engine result. These are the highlighted or boxed adverts displayed at the top of your search. The official site may not be the first link displayed after the paid ad look down the list until you spot the genuine one.
- Don't assume because the website has an '.org' web address, as this is no guarantee that it's the genuine site. For example, UK government websites have '.gov.uk' address.
- 4. When you think you have found the official site just take a few moments to double-check the site as it may even say that it is not officially affiliated with the official body. Go to the site's 'home' or 'about us' page

Another bad habit to break next month.

Jays

Each autumn a lot of my conversations go like this: "This morning I saw a weird pink and blue bird on my lawn." Me: "It's a Jay." "There's a parrot on my bird table!" Me: "It's a Jay." "I've just seen..." Me: "It's a Jay". Spotting such an exotic looking bird in the back garden gets even my most wildlife-averse friends reaching for the Blencowe bird identification hotline. Yet despite looking like it has flown in directly from the jungles of Costa Rica, the Jay lives in Sussex all year round. For most of the year it withdraws to the woodlands and leads an elusive life amongst the leaves. But in October it is time for the Jay to step out of the shadows.



Jays look fabulous. With extravagant pink plumage, a drooping black moustache and a snazzy electric blue flash through the wings, it's no surprise that the eminent Sussex naturalist, W.H. Hudson, called it 'The British Bird of Paradise'. Surprisingly, it's a member of the crow family. But while the related Ravens, Rooks, Crows and Jackdaws all wear black funereal feathers, the Jay obviously didn't get the memo about the

dress code! Gather the Crows for a family portrait and the Jay stands out like Danny La Rue in full drag amongst a crowd of coal miners. But, when the Jay opens its beak, it reveals its family heritage. The song of the Jay is a rough, rasping, nails-down-the-blackboard shriek, which would make any Crow proud.

The reason we see more Jays in the autumn is because they are busy. Jays are nuts about acorns and at this time of the year their favourite food is in plentiful supply. But the Jay is a clever bird. Aware that there are lean times ahead it starts making a long-term investment for surviving the winter. With up to nine acorns jammed in its beak and throat, the Jay flies far from the woodlands and hides these nuts in nooks and under dead leaves. With an impressive ability to remember exactly where he has stashed them, the Jay will return, and tuck into these life-saving larders in the cold days of winter. I've employed a similar strategy many times at parties! Faced with a full buffet at the start of the night, I hide a few piles of crisps and vol-au-vents behind curtains and cushions to help me get through the evening.

One Jay can store up to five thousand acorns in a season. Not all are remembered and retrieved, and from these lost acorns, mighty Oaks grow. I often wonder how many of the huge Oaks we see in Sussex were originally planted by Jays. Through the centuries these birds have been architects of the English countryside: a landscape created by the forgetfulness of a pink crow.

From the Vicarage

On the 8th of December 1903, from a barge on the Potomac River in West Virginia USA, a precision-made vehicle took off, to attempt the first manned flight in history. This vehicle was called the "Aerodrome" It had been designed by Samuel Pierpont Langley and each part was made by a team of professional engineers to Langley's specification. Several smaller unmanned models had been made and had worked well. The Aerodrome was propelled into the sky by a large catapult. It soared up. Then immediately crashed into the river. The pilot was rescued but the Aerodrome was damaged beyond repair; the project was abandoned.

Nine days later, the first manned flight was successfully made in North Carolina in a vehicle designed by two brothers, Orville and Wilbur Wright. They had no professional training but had a successful business building bicycles. When Wilbur flew their "Kitty Hawk" 852 feet in 59 seconds, they had already attempted the flight dozens of times over the previous four years. After each crash they repaired the Kitty Hawk; their team was their employees

from the factory, who gave their spare time voluntarily. The Wright brothers succeeded because they had passion.

When the clergy talk about ministering in the rural areas, we all attest to trying something that didn't work. However, if something is worth doing, we should not give up; rather if it is important to us, we may need to re-think, re-pray, re-try.

Paul told the Church in Galatia: "Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up. Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all people." Galatians 6:9-10.

Comparing small rural congregations with larger suburban churches is a mistake. A small church is not a failed large church, just as a satsuma is not a failed orange. These days, where we struggle more is finding volunteers to run events and people to attend them. And this is not just in church, but in other organisation such as village clubs, village cricket, the WI. What skills do we have? What activities can we do well to share our care in the community?

A thriving community is good for everyone and so, despite having little support for the coffee mornings in Wilmington, I shall continue to be at the village hall each 4th Thursday of the month. Despite having to cancel last month's pub quiz, we are doing it again this month. When your village club organises an event, support it; when someone is needed to help, volunteer. And, may I suggest, when your parish church opens its doors to invite you in for a special service, do give it a go. We are here for you. God bless.
